## **IDEAS FOR COUNCILS**

#### MATERIAL RECOVERY FACILITY TOURS

Engage your community by sparking their curiosity in what happens to recycling when it's picked up from the kerbside. Material Recovery Facility (MRF) tours will teach people why it's important to focus on quality rather than quantity when it comes to recycling. Taking residents and/or school groups behind-the scenes to see the journey their recycling takes beyond the bin, and what happens when we put non-recyclable items like soft plastics in the recycling bin.



### TRICKY ITEMS RECYCLING SESSIONS

People love doing the right thing by recycling instead of sending their waste to landfill. What better way to channel their goodwill than providing information on all the recycling schemes available to them for non-packaging items such as mobile phones, electronics, printer cartridges, mattresses, batteries and more!

### **RECYCLING PRESENTATIONS**

In recent years, recycling opportunities and item recyclability have changed and not all councils accept the same items for recycling. ### **IDEAS FOR COMMUNITIES**

#### **UPCYCLING WORKSHOP**

Use your creative skills to host an upcycling workshop. You could paint cans and turn them into plant pots, use leftover fabric to make cushion filling, make art out of broken items or coffee tables from old tyres, the sky is the limit! A quick google search of 'upcycling ideas' will inspire you to upcycle things you didn't know you could.

### **REPAIR CAFÉ**

Repair cafés are becoming more and more popular, fixing broken items such as bikes, electrical appliances and electronics. Consider creating your own pop-up repair café during National Recycling Week, or google search for one near you to fix any broken items you might have. Don't toss it, fix it!

### **IDEAS FOR EVERYONE**

#### **SWAP PARTY**

What's better than buying second-hand? Swapping things you don't use for other people's treasures! You only need a table (or a couple) where people can place the things they would like to swap and pick something in return.



### **SHARING ECONOMY SERVICES**

Australia's sharing economy is estimated to be worth \$15B per annum! It's also great for the environment. Buying second-hand, whether that be clothing, tools, or furniture, is a great way to help the environment and keep valuable resources out of landfill. Promote any services in your area that can help your community share more, such as Op shops, repair cafés, and tool libraries.

### **FURNITURE RECYCLING**

A great way to keep furniture out of landfill is to 'flip' pieces you either have at home, or get from online marketplaces for very cheap or even free! With some TLC, it will look brand new! There are many tutorials on YouTube on how to flip many pieces of furniture.
