Container Deposit Schemes[†] (CDS) can be a fantastic source of untied funding for not-for-profits and grassroots community organisations

CDS IS GREAT FOR THE ENVIRONMENT TOO

Prevents containers ending up in landfill or the ocean



Reduces the need for virgin plastics by making more recycled plastic available to manufacturers



Lowers greenhouse gas emissions



Reduces water usage



Helps create a circular economy

Check for the 10c refund mark on the container!



Most aluminium, glass, plastic, steel and liquid paperboard beverage containers between 150ml and 3L are eligible for a 10 cent refund

MAIN WAYS TO GET INVOLVED THERE ARE

INSPIRE GRASSROOTS COLLECTION

- Encourage your community to collect or save containers on your behalf - collect and deposit at your local refund point to access a 10 cent refund per container
- In some states, you can register for an ID or barcode that allows depositors to donate their refunds straight into your organisation's bank account*
- Get extra containers by enlisting the support of your workplace or local venues, like pubs, clubs and cafes to collect and donate their used containers

OPERATE A COLLECTION POINT

- Register and operate a container collection point, collecting containers from your neighbourhood
- Learn from organisations like <u>Scouts SA</u> which has been running collection points for nearly 40 years
- For further information about starting a collection point, consult the scheme operator in your state (links below)

PRO TIPS



Appoint a CDS Champion within your organisation to drive the program's success



Consider having a DIY collection point on your premises to capture additional containers that you can deposit directly



If operating as a CDS collection point, encourage your community to donate their refund to your organisation
